Recognition of air pollution is relatively recent. It is not uncommon to experience a feeling of suffocation in a closed environment. It is often ascribed to the lack of oxygen. Smoking of tobacco in a closed environment is an important source of indoor pollution. It may not be high quantitatively, but is significantly hazardous for health. It is because of the fact that there are over 3000 chemical constituents in tobacco smoke which have been identified. These are harmful for health.
